Note 1: The following suggested two-year course sequence is intended for students who plan to complete a bachelor's degree in Studio Arts or a related major in the California State University (CSU) system. Students who complete this degree and transfer to a participating CSU campus will be required to complete no more than 60 units after transfer to earn a bachelor's degree. It may not be appropriate preparation for students transferring to a CSU campus that does not accept the degree. Students who plan to complete this degree should consult with a counselor for additional information about participating CSU campuses as well as university admission, degree, and transfer requirements. These courses are options and may be substituted with other major elective courses outlined in the college catalog.

Note 2: It is recommended that students select courses that meet lower division major preparation requirements for their transfer university.

Note 3: Additionally, completion of Electives as needed to meet maximum of 60 CSU-transferable units required for the degree.
